Geography Learning Objectives	S/A	T/A
I can describe location using words including: left, right, next to, nearby, near, far, close to, further away, behind, in front of, further than, closer than, nearer than, closest, furthest away.		
I can make a Signpost Map!		

Starter: Can you remember your **address** from last week? Can you remember your **route to school**? If you live within the boundaries of the map provided, can you mark your route to school on it? I'm including a satellite view of a wider area to have a look at too and see what you can spot on it.

Main Challenge 1: We are building up to making some maps and plans of our own, but first we need to learn some new geography skills.

The word '**location**' means the **place where something is**. We can use words to describe location. We can also use words to compare the location of 2 different places. You started using this geography location vocab last week when you were describing your route to school! 👍

Look around you and use some of the geography location vocab to describe what is around you. For example: the rug is to my right. It is next to the dog and nearer than the candle.

Geography location vocab: left, right, next to, nearby, near, far, close to, further away, behind, in front of, further than, closer than, nearer than, closest, furthest away

Main Challenge 2: Create a Signpost Map! Choose a room in your house and sit in the middle of it. Write 'Me' in the middle of a piece of paper and using arrows of different lengths & going off in different directions write or draw at least 10 items around you. That is a Signpost Map! (I'm attaching an example of one of our classroom.) You can add more items, colour them in, and do as many rooms as you like. :D

Plenary: Show your Signpost Map to someone in your family, describing it using your geography location vocab. Choose at least one location-describing sentence to record with your Signpost Map.
