COTTON BUD ART

It is based on artists such as `Georges Seurat who painted small dots of colour to make an image.

It is called ***Pointillism***.

Look for a flower; lilac is in flower at the moment. It could be a daisy or something similar.

Try to use watercolour or thin poster paints if you have them.

- 2.Red and yellow to make orange
- 3.Blue and reds to make purple
